The BRUU Auction is rapidly approaching. Auction items are starting to roll in via the Web Form.


The Silent Auction: Opens for bidding on 15 Nov and closes on 10 Dec.




Drumming Third Sunday Nov 20

It has been a pleasure to work with her during the past 4 months. Thank you, thank you to all the members who took a crack at the pulpit during this time. We had some dynamite presentations. And thanks to Charlie Grimes for organizing the lay-led services.

Here are some updates:

-We are having a Welcome Back party for Rev. Charlotte on November 13th, the Sunday she is doing her Sabbatical review. Please make sure you complete your scrap book pages for her!

We had some issues with the company we first contracted with to repair our broken stained-glass windows and we are in the process of getting a detailed assessment of what needs to be done for each window in the sanctuary. Quotes from 3 different companies are still being gathered.

David Lane did a very detailed security audit review of our networking and IT systems. Our newly assembled IT Team will be work on the recommendations he has made to increase the security of our systems and data.

It was noted by staff that they are finding doors open or unlocked, especially on Tuesday mornings. If you are the last to leave on Sunday or Monday, please make sure that doors are closed and locked behind you. Signage has been ordered to place on doors.

The search for an Interim Music Director is in full swing. It appears we currently have 3 viable candidates.

The Board has come to realize that the way we are organized and therefore our Organizational Chart needs to be revised. Totally missing from this chart are the Stewardship Committee, the IT Committee, and the AV Team. We feel that this will require a group of people working together with a consultant. Representation from across our organization will need to be gathered for this work.

We need to begin to gather people to work on our Stewardship Team for this year's Stewardship Campaign. Dianne Lane will be putting out a call for interested people.


## Get Savvy About Affordable Housing

# THE PUZZLER November's puzzler


Back when I was doing my radio show, listeners would sometimes ask how much preparation we did in advance of every show.
